Syllables are how a word is broken apart by sound. There are three ways to count syllables: 1. clap them out! 2. Put your hand under your chin when you say the word. Count how many times your chin/hand go down when you say the word. Or 3. Say the word in a robot voice! <b>Then,</b> see your reading checklist for the week for directions and page numbers for vocab and journal time.</i></p>
