



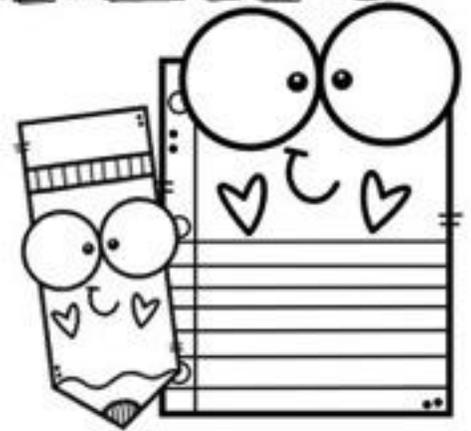

1. There were 348 buttons in the box and 278 buttons in the jar. How many buttons were there in all?



2. Grace collected 489 cans to recycle. Macie collected 543 cans. How many total cans did they collect?


